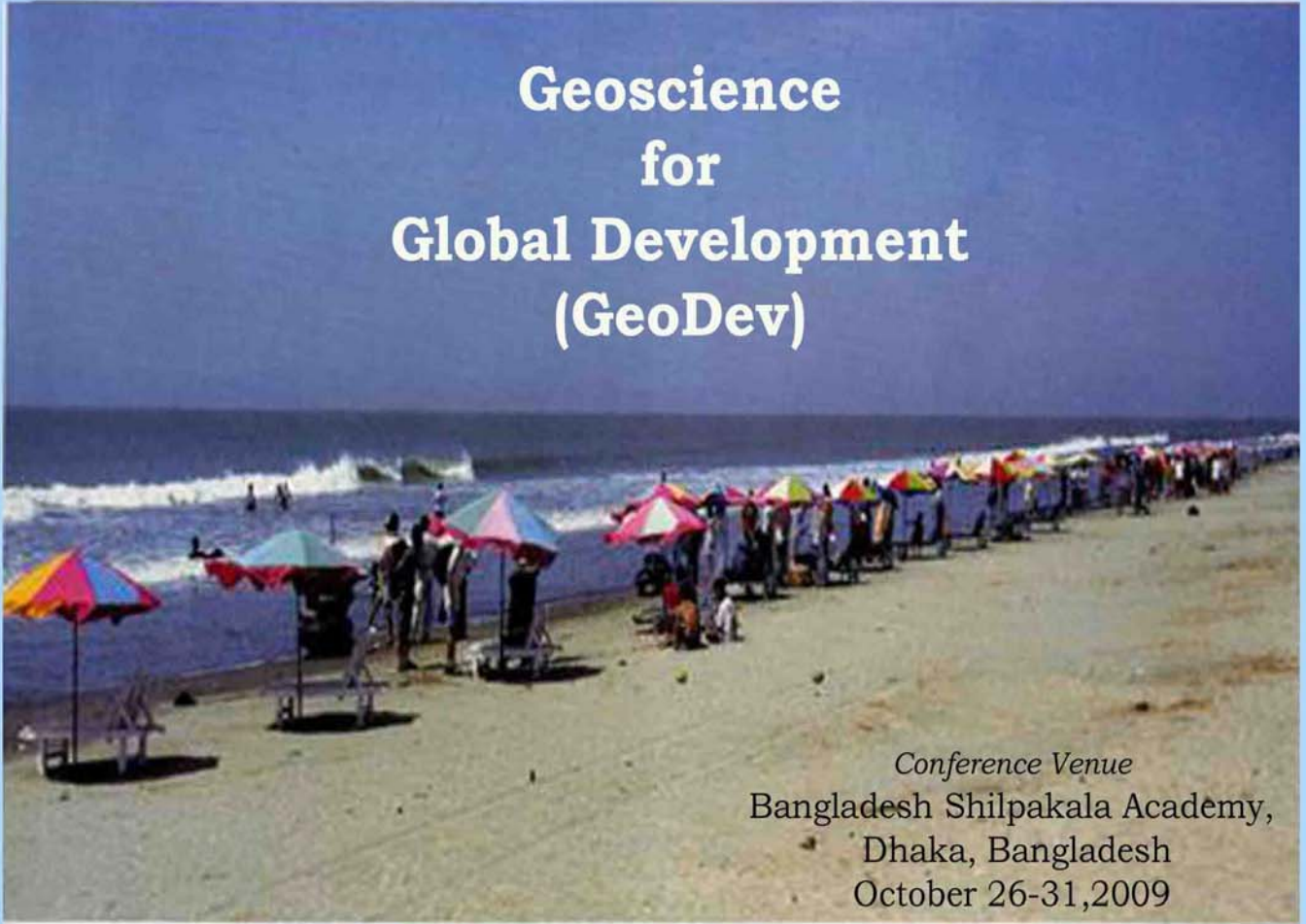

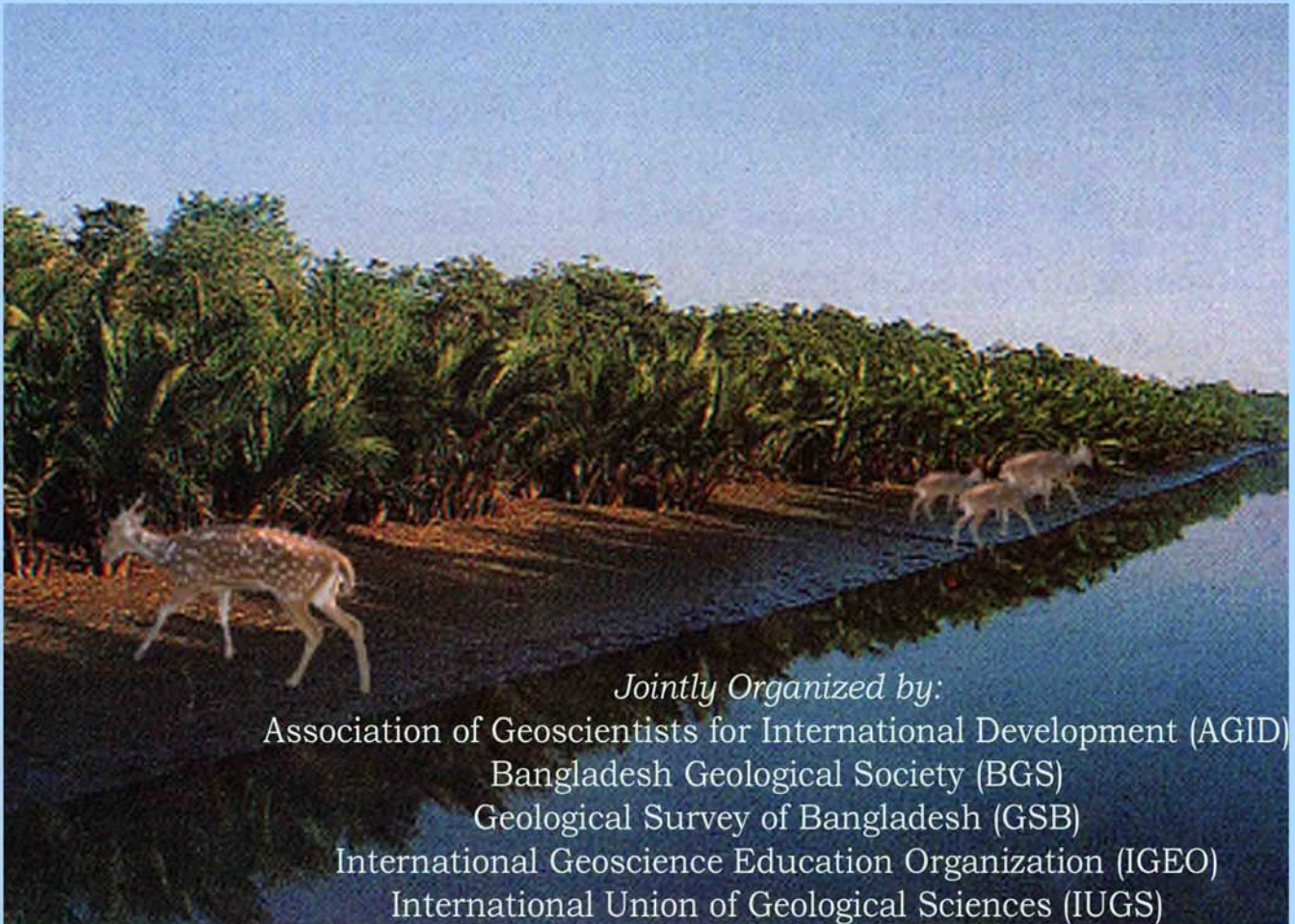

After circulation of the First Announcement of GeoDev, about 300 geoscientists (including more than 100 foreign geoscientists) from 33 countries have expressed their desire to attend the Conference.

**AGID:** The Association of Geoscientists for International Development (AGID) is a voluntary geoscientific organization. Its aim is to promote the application of geoscience for sustainable development and improvement of the quality of life in developing countries of the world. Current activities include networking based practice in groundwater development and management in low-income countries and promoting basic knowledge of the importance of geoscience in every day life for school children in developing countries in Africa and South Asia. **BGS:** The Bangladesh Geological Society (BGS) acts as the spokesman for the geoscientists of the country. ## SIGHT SEEING TOUR

Sight Seeing Tours, free of cost, will be arranged for the associated members of foreign delegates during the conference schedule. A local guide and free transport will be provided for each tour party. Minimum five associated numbers of the participants will be required to organize a tour party.

Tour-1: a) **Ahsan Manzil Museum:** The resident of Nawabs (rulers) of Dhaka and a silent spectator to many historical events. The renovated Ahsan Manzil is a monument of immense historical beauty and attraction for the tourists.

b) **Lalbagh Fort:** Built in 1678 during the period of Mughal Emperors is an attractive place for the tourists.

Tour-2: a) **Balda Garden:** Established in 1904. It is an ancient beautiful garden with about 1500 plants and trees covering 672 species and 87 families. Most of them are rare plants from different parts of the world.

b) **Sonargaon:** The oldest capital of the Bengal., It is built on the bank of the river Meghna and is only about 29 km south east of the Dhaka city. Folk arts and crafts museums at Sonar gaoan are attraction for the visitors.

## HOST COUNTRY-BANGLADESH

**Bangladesh:** Bangladesh occupies the major part of the Bengal Basin – the largest delta of the world. It is built up by the three mighty river systems - the Ganges, the Meghna and the Brahmaputra. It is a land of beauty with evergreen vegetation, lush green paddy fields, interconnected network of rivers and channels, long sandy beach, and hilly terrains. Eighty percent of the country is flat covered by thick Recent Alluvial deposits and the rest is occupied by Tertiary hills and Quaternary hillocks (terraces of red Pleistocene deposits). **The Sundarbans** – UNESCO declared world heritage and **the Cox's Bazaar Sea Beach** – the largest unbroken sea beach of the world occupy the south-western and south-eastern coastal parts of the country respectively. Panoramic views of these areas are great attractions for tourism. The major mineral resources of the country are natural gas, coal, peat, hard rock, limestone, glass sand, white clay and mineral sands. The Jamuna Bridge – the longest bridge across the mighty river Jamuna in the North- Western part of the country is also a modern architectural beauty for the tourists.

**Dhaka:** Dhaka, the capital city of Bangladesh, was founded in 1608 as the seat of the Imperial Mughal Viceroy of Bengal. It stands on the bank of the River Buriganga. Dhaka is a densely populated city of around 20 million. It was famous for its fine silk and Muslin clothes. There are many modern and ancient architectural buildings and historical places that attract tourists from home and abroad. The most attractive places are **the Lalbagh Fort, Ashan Manzil and Boldha Garden**, National Museum, Dhaka University, Baitul Mukarram Mosque, National Zoo, Botanical Garden, Suhrawardy Uddan (Garden), Chandrima Uddan (Garden), National Assembly Complex, Ramna Green and Bangla Academy in the Dhaka city. Also there are attractive places like **Shonargaon Folk Arts & Craft Museum** and the Savar Sriti Shoudha (National Mausoleum) situated 29 and 30 km away from the Dhaka city respectively.

### **GENERAL INFORMATION OF BANGLADESH**

**Location:** Bangladesh lies in the Southeast Asia within the SAARC Region. It is bordered by India in the west, north and northeast and by Myanmar in the southeast. The entire south-eastern part of the country is exposed to the Bay of Bengal.

**Language:** Bangla is the Mother tongue. English is also used as the second language.

**Climate:** In general, the country experiences bright sunshine with heavy rainfall in the summer & rainy seasons (April-August), clean sky and moderately high temperature with low rainfall in the autumn and late autumn (August-December), and cool and pleasant weather in the winter and spring seasons (December-April).

**Food Habit:** Rice, fish and vegetables are the main food items. Meats and breads are also common foods.

**Temperature:** Normally, winter (December-January) temperature: 10<sup>0</sup>c to 21<sup>0</sup>c and summer (May-June) temperature: 21<sup>0</sup>c to 37<sup>0</sup>c.

**Rainfall:** About 1194 - 3454 mm annually.

**Humidity:** Maximum 70% -80 % (August-September), and lowest 57% (January-March).

**Time:** + 6.00 hrs with GMT.

**Type of Clothing:** Tropical dresses in summer, rainy, autumn and late autumn. Woolen clothes and suits in winter and spring.
